# **August Parish Council Report.**

Jim Gardner led our devotion from the "Word for Today " for 7 August, based on Psalm 42:2 'My soul thirsts for you'. Godliness isn't a culture, its an attitude of the heart. People look at he outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.

There was a short discussion about the importance of submitting nominations for Parish Clerk as well as the vacant place on the parish council. Councillors Lois Shipley, Steph Holland and Judith Begg have indicated their agreement to serve a further three year term.

Part of the meeting involved discussing the letter from the Alpine Presbytery, asking for feed back on our view of the priorities in the Alpine Presbytery's list of goals in their current strategic framework.

The time has come to replace the increasingly faulty heaters in the St Stephens Hall. The installation of heat pumps is planned for completion in late August 2019.

The row of silver birch trees needing to be kept clear of power lines on Wai-iti Road will be pruned instead of removed.

Another look over the new budget for the next financial year, found it ready to be presented at the Parish AGM to be held after the service at Trinity on 15 September.

With the vital outreach of the monthly afternoon communion service held at Trinity Chapel, there was discussion around the need to support the Pastoral group and Molly Thomson as they ensure there are enough drivers to bring people to this much loved service.

Brent commented on the Caleb Leadership Course he attended in Nelson. It covered 8 leadership skill areas; relationship skills, communication, motivation, management, creativity and decision making, training, leadership and coaching. Brent found it very worthwhile. He will be on leave from 19 August to 1 September.

Both Brent and Rory mentioned how successful and enjoyable the Sri Lankan cultural dinner was for our Parish. Well done Indi and her wonderful family.

Rory has devoted energy to encourage the Pleasant Point Parish to consider their membership and value belonging together. Pastorally July was a very busy month.

# **ERIC BARKER** – "A Musical Journey."



The 7<sup>th</sup> August was a special day for one of our parishioners, a man who has given a lifetime of service, particularly with his music, in a number of community groups, and particularly the church in Waimate and Timaru.

This is Eric Baker, and the date in August represents the completion of 70 years playing the organ and

piano and organising and contributing to many musical events over the years.

Eric's initial stint as church organist was with St Paul's in Timaru starting on the 7<sup>th</sup> August 1949 as a young 21-year-old. With true Presbyterian caution he was taken on for a three-month trial period but must have come up trumps as it was not until 1962 that he left the position having moved to Waimate. It is interesting to note that during the time of Eric's tenure there were 263 weddings in the church!

For a short time, Eric was a member of the Knox choir in Waimate, but it was not long (1963) until he was appointed assistant organist. From 1973 to 1980 he also played for the evening services and in 1981 when Esme Aitcheson retired, replaced her as full time organist. It was very 'full on' as there were three services on Sunday – 9.30am 'contemporary' and 11am and 7pm 'traditional'.

In August 1997 Eric and June returned to Timaru and Eric was invited to join the St. Stephens' organ roster, which at that time also included Don Jackson, Nancy Bennett and David Lockhart. Over the years there were six special services, organised by Eric, entitled 'Old Hymns Services' taken from the congregations' favourites and interspersed with solos and instrumental items.



In 2009 Eric returned to St. Pauls' where he sang in the choir for a short time and once again joined the organ roster, this time with Isobel McKinnon and Esme Turnbull. During the latter part of 2010 the earthquake severely damaged the church which, being considered unsafe, was closed with the

congregation moving to Chalmers church. Chalmers was also classed as unsafe, so Trinity and St Stephens became the places of worship where Eric is on the organ roster at Trinity and also plays the keyboard at St Stephens.

June has been a mainstay for Eric for the last 65 years since they were married at St. Pauls' church by Rev. Russell Kenward. She has written the lyrics for many of Eric's compositions, some of which are played at services to the enjoyment of all present.

We should remember that Eric's amazing musical contribution has not been limited to the church. He and June have made major contributions to the Savage Club. Eric received recognition of his 56 years in the club with a function in early July attended by the national president. The Scottish Society are another group lucky enough to have Eric contributing and generously sharing his musical talents. The South Canterbury Women's club 'Music Circle' was another community activity that Eric and June supported until they disbanded in about 2015.

But it is the Presbyterian Church in South Canterbury that has been incredibly blessed and enriched by Eric's contribution over 7 decades. And perhaps it is fitting that the great pipe organ that used to be in Trinity Church in Barnard Street and the Bosendorfer piano from Chalmers

Church, both of which Eric loves playing, have become his prime musical instruments.

Thank you Eric and June for your amazing contribution to the life of our church and the local community.




